ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION (Section 415B-34 Hawaii kevised Statutes)

The undersigned, desiring to form a nonprofit corporation under the laws of the State of Hawaii, certify as follows:

I

The name of the corporation shall be: OAHU LEAGUE OF THE HAWAII YOUTH SOCCER ASSOCIATION

III

The period of its duration is perpetual.

IV

Section 1. The purpose for which the corporation is organized:

- (a) To develop, provide and administer non-profit public educational soccer competition among youth under nineteen years of age.
- (b) The transaction of any or all lawful activities for which nonprofit corporations may be incorporated under Chapter 415B, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- Section 2. And in furtherance of said purposes, the corporation shall have all powers, rights, privileges and immunities, and shall be subject to all of the liabilities conferred or imposed by law upon corporations of this nature, and shall be subject and have all the benefits of all general laws with respect to corporations.

The number of directors constituting the initial Board of Directors is 4. The officers of the corporation shall consist of a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. The following are the names and residence street addresses of the initial officers and directors:

The corporation has no members.

VII

The corporation is not organized for profit and it shall not issue any stock, and no part of its assets, income or earnings shall be used for dividends, loans or otherwise withdrawn or distributed to or inure to the benefit of any of its, directors or officers or to any individuals, except in payment for services actually rendered to the corporation. The corporation shall be organized and operated exclusively for cultural, charitable and educational purposes, and no part of its activities shall be to carry on propaganda, or otherwise attempt to influence legislation.

VIII

The corporation shall have the power to indemnify each present, former and future officer and director, employee or agent of the corporation in the manner provided in Section 415B-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

If the corporation shall cease to exist or shall be dissolved, all property and assets of the corporation of every kind, after payment of its just debts, shall be distributed only to one or more public agencies, corporations, trusts or foundations having like purposes and organized and operated exclusively for cultural, charitable and educational purposes, no part of whose assets, income or earnings may be used for dividends or otherwise withdrawn or distributed to or inure to the benefit of any private member or individual and no part of the activities of which is to carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation. In no event shall distribution be made to any organization unless it qualifies as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or any future corresponding provision) with purposes similar or related to those of the corporation.

We certify under the penalties of Section 415B-158, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that we have read the above statements and that the same are true and correct.
